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Types of Financial Aid

Students should submit the FAFSA at fafsa.gov as soon as it becomes available and no later than the March 2 priority deadline. FAFSA results are used to determine eligibility for scholarships, grants, work-study and loans.

Undocumented students with AB 540 status may qualify for financial aid through the CA Dream Act Application at dream.csac.ca.gov, including exemption from nonresident tuition. International students are not eligible for federal, state or university financial aid and should explore private scholarship opportunities in the U.S. and their home countries.

The UCLA Center for Scholarships & Scholar Enrichment (scholarshipcenter.ucla.edu) provides resources to help students identify scholarship opportunities. Additional funding may be available through community organizations, faith-based groups and community college foundations.

California residents may also qualify for UC's Blue and Gold, the Middle Class Scholarship (MCS) and the Native American Opportunity Plan. These programs can help cover tuition and other educational costs and generally require submission of the FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application by March 2nd.

Dates & Deadlines

August 1

Application opens for Fall 2027

October 1–November 30

Application submission window for Fall 2027 applicants

October 1

Filing period expected to be available on or before October 1 for Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and CA Dream Act Application for all applicants. Filing period opens for GPA Verification Form (required for CA residents only for Cal Grant consideration)

January 31

Deadline to submit your Transfer Academic Update (TAU)

March 2

Deadline for applicants to submit your FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application

Late April

Admission notification (transfer applicants)

June 1

Deadline to submit your enrollment deposit and applications for on-campus housing

July 1

Deadline for official transcripts
